- Praise God that Eric's thyroid cancer tests came back clear, and all is well.





Fall Wednesday Gathering — Reading Scripture with Jesus



THE LIFE LANGUAGES SEMINAR IS RETURNING TO CDA BIBLE CHURCH ON OCTOBER 26!

Mark your calendar for Saturday, October 26. We once again will be hosting the all-day LIFE LANGUAGES seminar, presented by counselor Jan Vetter. Sign up in the lobby!

So...what is LIFE LANGUAGES all about? It's about learning how you (and those around you) communicate. Life Languages center around the seven languages that everyone speaks: Mover, Doer, Influencer, Responder, Shaper, Producer, and Contemplator. Everyone speaks these languages with a different level of effectiveness and intensity. The 7 Life Languages are communication styles that fall under 3 Intelligence Categories: Act, Feel, and Think. Each Life Language has its own unique characteristics that reveal your interactive style and preferences.

Here's how it works: before the October 26 seminar, you'll go online and take the Life Language survey to determine your Life Language profile. The survey costs \$50 (which you pay at the website). Then, come on out to the seminar with your survey in hand to learn all about how your Life Language functions in real life and what the Life Languages of other people look like.

The cost of the seminar is \$15 per person (pay by cash or check at the door). We are trying to work out childcare, but that plan is not yet solidified.

The arguments <u>AGAINST</u> including Mark 16:9-20 in our Bibles:

- The two oldest existing Greek manuscripts (dated from 325 and 340 A.D.) do not contain this section and neither do about 100 other ancient manuscripts translated into other languages. A few ancient manuscripts put asterisks next to Mark 16:9-20 to indicate that it is an addition to the original text.
- 2. According to their writings, almost all the Greek manuscripts known to Eusebius (who died in 339) and Jerome (who died in 419) did not have these verses.
- 3. In a few other manuscripts, there are two other endings— one shorter and one with some additions.
- 4. About one-third of the vocabulary is totally different from the rest of the Gospel of Mark, and there is a very awkward grammatical transition between Mark 16:8 and 16:9.
- 5. Most contemporary scholars reject these verses as original.

The arguments <u>FOR</u> including Mark 16:9-20 in our Bibles:

 Many very early Christian writers refer to this passage in their writings. This shows that the early Christians knew about this passage in the Gospel of Mark and accepted it as genuine.

- Papias refers to Mark 16:18. He wrote around A.D. 100.
- Justin Martyr's first Apology quoted Mark 16:20 (A.D. 151).
- Irenaeus, in Against Heresies, quoted Mark 16:13 and remarked on it (A.D. 180).
- Hippolytus in *Peri Charismaton* quoted Mark 16:18 and 19. In his homily on the heresy of Noetus, he refers to Mark 16:19. He wrote while he was Bishop of Portus (A.D. 190-227).
- Vicentius, Bishop of Thibari, quoted from 2 of the verses in the 7th Council of Carthage held under Cyprian (A.D. 256). Augustine, a century and a half later, in his reply, recited the words again.
- The apocryphal Acts of Pilate contains Mark 16:15-18 (thought to be written somewhere around A.D. 200).
- The Apostolic Constitutions clearly allude to 16:15 in two places and quote Mark 16:16 outright (thought to be written somewhere in the late third century or the early fourth century).
- 2. The overwhelming majority of ancient manuscripts do include this passage.
