Everyday Gospel Living: We're thankful to share how God is working here in Argentina in each of these quarterly newsletters. Normally we share a list of what's been happening, but this newsletter, we just wanted to share with you an overview of our daily lives. Each day brings new opportunities to speak the name of Christ—in ordinary moments, relationships, and ministry.

The Message We Live For: The Gospel is the reason we came—the truth that shapes everything. God, the holy Creator, made us for Himself, but we have all turned away. Because of sin, we deserve judgment. Yet in love, God sent His Son Jesus to live perfectly, die in our place, and rise again, offering forgiveness and eternal life to all who repent and believe. That message fuels our ministry.

What Gospel Work Looks Like: Gospel work here isn't flashy—it's daily. It's shared in the quiet conversation with a friend at church, the counseling session in our living room, the sermon, or communion shared together with our church family. The gospel changes us in our hearts first as we seek to live more holy lives ourselves, and then every moment is a chance to proclaim and live that good news.

At the Seminary: As Academic Director and Biblical counseling professor at William Carey Seminary, Eric helps train pastors and counselors for ministry across Latin America. He recently spoke at the seminary's annual conference and will teach "Introducción a la Consejería Bíblica" in January 2026.

In Friendships: We're thankful for new and deepening relationships with neighbors, our kid's baseball teammates, and others. Please pray for boldness to share Christ's hope in everyday conversations.

At Home: Our first ministry is to one another and our kids. Homeschooling gives daily moments to talk about sin, grace, and the Savior who loves us. We are so thankful for our growing boys and the challenge it is to raise them to be Christ-like men.




Events, Ministries, and Opportunities


Group Discussion Questions

- 1. Read 2 Timothy 3v1-17 (in the CSB), and consider the following questions:
- 2. Looking at vss. 1-5 do we see people like this today? Such people are always present. Paul seems to think such people will be prevalent even within the church. How are we supposed to discern them so as to avoid them?

- 3. Looking at vss. 6-9 This passage speaks of foolishness and a false kind of learning. What does foolishness and false learning look like in this passage, and what might they look like in the world around us today as well?
- 4. In vs. 10-13, Paul says to Timonthy that he has "followed my teaching, conduct, purpose, faith, patience, love, and endurance, and persecutions and sufferings;" how is it that following the way of Jesus which Jesus claims will lead to rest for our souls also looks like persecution and suffering?
- 5. In vss. 14-17 what is Paul's encouragement to Timothy (and to us!) for staying the course in our faith? What outcomes in our lives should we look for as we obey Paul's instructions here? Ask yourself, "What would these look like in my own life today?"



Pastor Kurt and Sara Staeuble are leading a marriage series this fall where we will gain a greater theological understanding of what God




