This March, we decided to take advantage of the ancient practices of Lent. Many have considered this a "Catholic" thing, but after chatting it through with our leadership team, we recognized the opportunity to invite people to make preparations for Easter, the most important day in the church calendar.

We had over 100 members participate in Ash Wednesday. We had 3 time slots: before work, at lunch time, and after work to pray together, to come and be reminded of our human frailty because of sin, and an invitation to repent and receive a small wooden cross to wear for 40 days leading to Easter. There was positive feedback with people describing how important it was for them to draw near to God as they reflected on their rich salvation. We have also been sending people a daily devotional leading up to Easter.

Our Life Groups are growing in size and several are now needing to multiply which can be a challenge. We have encouraged each group to keep inviting new people to join them. In this way, we are always reaching out. Cape Town is growing rapidly with many people moving here from other parts of the country. As a result, we are finding new people visiting Durbanville Community Church every week and staying. At the end of the month, we had our prayer meeting at the church and it was the largest in attendance to date. Of course, I always wish more would come and pray, but there is progress!

The tutoring program in Klipheuwel continues to grow with more students coming out to learn. One of Cyndi's students was failing her subjects and so Cyndi took her to an educational psychologist to explore her options. It turns out, this girl's IQ is so low that she is barely able to get through the subjects. She will not be able to pass the higher grades, so they are helping her with concessions and when she is a little older, they will be able to enroll her in a training program that is less academic and more practical in nature. Apparently there are many children in this situation and the need for training is huge because of the high unemployment rate among young people in South Africa.

One of our Easter highlights was our sunrise service where we drove up to the top of a hill in the dark and heard testimonies and a brief message as the sun came up. May you be full of joy as you celebrate our risen Lord! Thank you for your generous support, encouragement and prayers!
