On February 23 we were able to spend our first night in the village! We are so grateful to be able to settle in one place, but we've had several problems with the water, and we had to change the pipes. Since we have always lived in furnished houses, we do not have our own furniture, so Hugo made the furniture that we need. Praise God he finished without any injuries or accidents!

We also thank God that our work team is complete. On February 28, Hugo's brother, Diego, and his family arrived. We were also able to finish Vincente's fence (another teammate) before the rainy season to prevent landslides towards his house. We are settling in our homes, but once settled we can begin the process of learning the Tseltal language and culture. Another thing that we are planning as a team is literacy. We have seen the great need that people have to learn to read and write in Spanish.

In May we had the first medical brigade in the village. It was a great blessing and help in this stage prior to evangelization. The doctors who came gave free consultations and medicines. We had doctors, eye doctors and dentists, and we even had haircuts. More than 150 Tseltales could be attended. It was good for them to see that our desire to help the village is genuine. Thanks to God!

We thank God for the opportunity we had to travel to Chihuahua for some conferences that the mission with which we work holds every two years. We were able to spend a few days with our friends from the Mission. It was very encouraging to see them and talk about all that the Lord is doing in different parts of our country. Each team was able to share struggles, achievements, difficulties and how the Lord is working in each one and in the people with whom the Gospel is being shared. We felt very blessed to see that God continues to use his children and that He is being glorified.

- For unity in the team. And that God directs us in all the decisions that we have to make and that we have the same feeling. May we have good communication, patience, and love with each other. That we can reflect towards the people the love of God
- For the health of Mariana. She has been battling her allergies, especially her allergy to smoke.
