It was a long day for the children, but they won fourth place. Most importantly, they learned new things from the Word of God because of this competition.

We have started a training class on Sunday mornings. All six participants are enjoying it and I hope that they will use what they are learning in their life and will help others. I recently had the opportunity to preach in the first official church the Lord helped to start in the South in September 1983, almost 40 years ago. It was a joy to see old faces and new faces. The family is doing quite well. I do have body and chest pains sometimes. I thank the Lord that He is enabling me to continue doing what I can do. I am always thankful to the Lord for He is in control. I have been on the road since the month of November between Kara and another part of the country. We had good meetings in the South. It is a long drive from North to South round trip, but I am always thankful to the Lord for His protection and safety.
