Love INC (Love In the Name of Christ) offers *Jobs for Life*™, a program all about helping people build real stability and break the cycle of poverty. Instead of just offering short-term help, it gives folks the tools, skills, and support they need to find steady work and keep it long-term.

The program serves several key purposes:

- **Holistic Skill Development:** People pick up all kinds of skills—everything from budgeting and professional communication to seeing how work matters from a biblical perspective.
- **Relationship-Based Mentoring:** Each participant is paired with a mentor—or “champion”—who sticks with them, offering encouragement and support during the training and as they get started in a new job.
- **Overcoming Barriers:** The program helps tackle common roadblocks, like not having much job experience, trouble getting transportation, and not knowing a lot of people in the area.
- **Community Integration:** By connecting participants with local business owners and church members, the program helps build a strong support network that sets people up for long-term success.

Love INC sees this program as part of its bigger mission—mobilizing local churches to really help people change their lives “In the Name of Christ,” moving beyond just handouts to offer real support and a hand up. They call this “Redemptive Compassion,” and they are passionate about seeing lives transformed and the people of God participating in the process!

## Group Discussion Questions

Read 1 Peter 1:13-16. If going through these questions as a group, have someone read the passage aloud.

1. The first directive given by Peter is, **“Prepare your minds for action,”** which literally means in the Greek, “Gird up the loins of your mind for action.” Why is the disposition of our mind so important for dealing well with the trials we face? What type of mindset do you think would help a person endure a trial successfully?
2. The second direction Peter gives is this: **“Exercise self-control.”** Why is exercising self-control so difficult when in the midst of a trial? How does exercising self-control benefit a person going through a trial. How can God help us exercise self-control?
3. Peter’s third directive is, **“Put all your hope in the gracious salvation that will come to you when Jesus Christ is revealed to the world.”** How does putting our hope in the future return of Jesus help a person dealing with a trial? What types of things do people mistakenly put their hope toward? What hope keeps you afloat as you seek to faithfully pursue Jesus? Is it possible to cultivate more hope into our hearts?
4. Peter’s fourth instruction reads like this: **“You must live as God’s obedient children.”** How is obedience to God a mark that we are trusting Him? How might our experience in a trial be impacted if we choose not to obey God?
5. Lastly, Peter gives this direction: **“You must be holy in everything you do.”** In this verse, the meaning of holy is “different” or “separate.” Why is it that God calls believers to live a life different than the world around them? How would you describe a “holy” Christian life? When Peter talks about being holy, is he talking about perfection?
6. The overarching concern on Peter’s heart is that these scattered, persecuted believers would not only endure trials well, but also get something out of going through their trials. What does God want us to gain when we hit rough spots in life?

**Who: Adults of all ages**

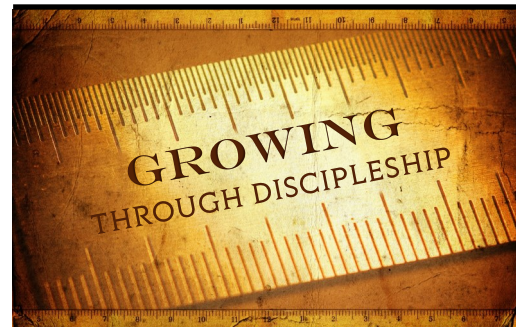
