Group Discussion Questions Advent—Joy

- 1. **Biblical Joy vs. Happiness:** The sermon distinguishes biblical joy from worldly happiness or pleasure. How would you define the difference in your own words, and where have you seen this distinction in your life?
- 2. **Joy in God's Presence:** Psalm 16:11 says, "In Your presence is fullness of joy." What practices or moments most help you sense the presence of God, and how does that influence your experience of joy?
- 3. **Mirror Neurons & Spiritual Formation:** The sermon mentions that we "mirror" the emotions of those around us. How does spending time with joyful believers or with God Himself shape your emotional and spiritual life?
- 4. **Joy in Salvation:** From the lost sheep to the prodigal son, Jesus teaches that heaven rejoices when the lost are found. Why do you think salvation brings such "great joy" in Scripture, and how have you experienced joy in your own salvation story?
- 5. "Great Joy" Across Scripture: The phrase "great joy" appears in moments of anointing, deliverance, worship, Christ's birth, resurrection, ascension, and the spread of the gospel. Which of these moments speaks to you the most and why do you think it is associated with "great joy"?
- 6. **Simeon's Joy:** Simeon experienced profound joy when he finally saw the promised Messiah. What can Simeon teach us about waiting on God and about recognizing God's promises when they are fulfilled?
- 7. **Joy in Hard Circumstances:** The sermon notes that joy comes from the inside, not from circumstances. What helps you maintain joy during seasons of difficulty, stress, or uncertainty?
- 8. **Joy as a Witness:** Early Christians often responded to Jesus with joy, which became part of their testimony to others. How can believers today reflect joy in a way that draws others toward Christ?


