- **HOW**: Bring yourself; the good, the bad, and the hidden. God desires to meet with you, speak to you, and draw you close to himself.




- Read Mark 11:1-7. Why did Jesus ride into Jerusalem on a humble colt rather than a mighty horse? Was it okay for Jesus to send a pair of disciples to get a colt that belonged to someone else? What was the significance of the colt never being ridden?
- Read Mark 11:8-10. Why were the people so excited and responsive to Jesus' grand entrance into Jerusalem? Was the crowd properly perceiving Jesus and His mission?
- How is what happens in Mark 11 a fulfilment of prophecy according to Zechariah 9:9?
- In what way is Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem the beginning of the end of a long journey? What statement is Jesus making by riding into Jerusalem in this manner?
- Why do you think Jesus waited so long before truly going public with who He is? Does this very public entrance help you to better understand some of the more 'secretive' elements of Jesus' previous behavior?
