Inviting All Men!

"Prayer is the means by which we push back the curse that's infected the world and infected us." – Tylor Staton

A new prayer gathering for men has started up at our church, Thursday mornings at 6:00 AM, in the prayer room at CDA Bible Church. As men, we all too often rush in to solve problems and fix broken things in our own strength when, in truth, our own will and strength often fall short, especially when we're talking about spiritual things. The quote by pastor and author Tyler Staton is our inspiration for this prayer gathering - that the men of our church would come together regularly to fight on our knees against our enemy - the Devil – on behalf of God's Kingdom and for the sake of our families, our church, our community, and the world. That we would implore our almighty Father to do the things that we can't – to change hearts, to subdue sin, to push back the darkness, to restrain evil.

Here's how this gathering works: at 6:00 AM, when you come in from outside through the prayer room doors (the northwest corner of the building, along 4th St.), there will be a sign on the inside wall stating the prayer theme for the day. The prayer room will already be set for a time of silent individual prayer and reflection; enter the room and use the resources of the room to wade into God's presence silently. Then, at 6:15 AM, the prayer host will call whoever is present to pray together aloud. The host might offer a focusing thought or Scripture, will offer an opening prayer, and then whoever wants to pray aloud may. When it seems that everyone is done praying, but no later than 7:00 AM, the host will close the prayer gathering, and the participants will depart.

If you're a guy of any age (boys under 18 need to attend with an adult), and if your heart is stirred to pray after God's kingdom, then this gathering is for you.

Romans 12v1-21 (NLT)

¹And so, dear brothers and sisters, I plead with you to give your bodies to God because of all he has done for you. Let them be a living and holy sacrifice—the kind he will find acceptable. This is truly the way to worship him. ²Don't copy the behavior and customs of this world, but let God transform you into a new person by changing the way you think. Then you will learn to know God's will for you, which is good and pleasing and perfect.

³Because of the privilege and authority God has given me, I give each of you this warning: Don't think you are better than you really are. Be honest in your evaluation of yourselves, measuring yourselves by the faith God has given us. ⁴Just as our bodies have many parts and each part has a special function, ⁵so it is with Christ's body. 

Be patient in trouble, and keep on praying. ¹³When God's people are in need, be ready to help them. Always be eager to practice hospitality.

¹⁴Bless those who persecute you. Don't curse them; pray that God will bless them. ¹⁵Be happy with those who are happy, and weep with those who weep. ¹⁶Live in harmony with each other. Don't be too proud to enjoy the company of ordinary people. And don't think you know it all! ¹⁷Never pay back evil with more evil. Do things in such a way that everyone can see you are honorable. ¹⁸Do all that you can to live in peace with everyone.

¹⁹Dear friends, never take revenge. Leave that to the righteous anger of God. For the Scriptures say, "I will take revenge; I will pay them back," says the LORD. ²⁰Instead, "If your enemies are hungry, feed them. If they are thirsty, give them something to drink. In doing this, you will heap burning coals of shame on their heads."

VESPERS PRAYER GATHERING

God's people have always been a people of prayer. Psalm 55 declares: "As for me, I will call upon God, and the LORD shall save me. Evening and morning and at noon I will pray, and cry aloud, and He shall hear my voice". Jesus teaches us to "pray at all times" (Matt. 5v44), and likewise, Paul encourages the church to "pray without ceasing" (1 Thess. 5v16).

We want to be a church family that entrusts ourselves and this world to the Living God through prayer at all times and in all ways. We want to be a church known for our prayerful dependence on God. It is because of this that we want to invite you to a time of evening prayer on November 24.

In many times and seasons across the history of the Church of Jesus, his disciples would gather in the evening for special times of prayer and worship, praise and silence, intercession and confession—this has traditionally been called Vespers. Vespers means "Evening." It is simply an old word used by the church across time to denote a special call to prayer in the evening hours of the day; this is what we are inviting you into—a time of concentrated prayer in the evening, a time of Vespers.

Would you join us to pray, worship, and wait on God? We really look forward to what He will do as we come together for His glory, our good, and the love of our city.
