





About Holy Week Bible Readings

The week leading up to Easter Sunday is a special time of the year where the church comes together to reflect on the life and teachings of Jesus, culminating in His resurrection. We also engage in prayer, asking God to draw us close to himself as he transforms our hearts, minds, and lives into "the image of Christ."

We want to invite you to join us for extended times of reading and meditation on the Scriptures that point us to Jesus, encourage us in His hope, and direct our lives to live for Him. Drop into the Prayer Room at any of the listed times to participate in the communal reading aloud of the Scriptures. You can jump in and read a chapter or two at a time or simply listen while others read aloud.

Group Discussion Questions

The triumphal entry of Jesus to Jerusalem is recorded in all four gospels (Matthew 21:1-11, Mark 11:11, Luke 28-40; John 12:12-19). For this discussion, have four different people volunteer to read the accounts out loud.

As you hear the different Gospel accounts read, listen for differing details. Each Gospel writer offers a few unique components to the story.

1. Jesus' entering into Jerusalem on a donkey was a bold declaration that his kingdom wasn't like earthly kingdoms. What are some of the ways Jesus' kingdom differs from the kingdoms of the world?
2. Many people who shouted their praise to Jesus didn't really understand Jesus' true mission, thinking he was going to be a political/military leader. How might these people have come to such conclusions about Jesus?
3. In Luke's Gospel, the reaction of the Pharisees to Jesus is recorded (verse 39). What did they say to Jesus? At what level of frustration do you think the Pharisees were at? How did Jesus respond to the Pharisees?

John's Gospel offers a few extra nuggets to the Triumphal Entry account:

4. How does John describe how the disciples understood what was going on with Jesus? (verses 16-17)
5. What connection is there to Lazarus being raised from the dead according to verse 17-18?
6. What complaint did the Pharisees offer according to verse 19?
7. What does Holy Week mean to you? Do you have a favorite part of Holy Week?
