Girona, Spain—Greater Europe Mission

Throughout Europe, evangelical Christianity is a minority - in our area of Spain, only 2% of people are evangelical, disciples of Jesus Christ. The question is then, how can Christians advance the Gospel in this cultural climate? The simple answer is "serve them". We believe that through selfless acts of service by Christians, the Holy Spirit can stir people's interest and curiosity. This curiosity leads to questions: what makes you different, why do you care for me, why are you doing this for us? These questions and curiosity are marks of soil well-prepared to receive the Gospel.

We are seeing God give us an opportunity to serve with a local church planter, Eliseo. Mark met Eliseo in one of his earliest Catalan classes, and they quickly formed a friendship over doing ministry in Girona. Eliseo and his family immigrated from El Salvador and, through God's providence, he is now planting a church here in Girona. God has used Eliseo in significant and exciting ways to draw a lot of youth to faith.

This summer, we will be welcoming a short-term team from [Coeur d'Alene Bible Church's Youth Ministry] to serve alongside Eliseo and his youth! We're super excited for this opportunity to serve together and join God in what He is doing through the youth of this area. Would you pray for us in this? For the planning, the training, all the logistics to get the team here, for health and energy of everyone for the week they are here, and for what God wants to accomplish in and through both this team and Eliseo's church.

Prayer Requests:

- God's provision of financial support to increase by \$2,000 monthly to meet the increase in cost of living and a recent decrease in donor support. Andrea will come to CDA, May 13-26 to meet with sponsors and raise support.
- A new place to live due to our property manager notifying us of their intent to sell our current apartment. They want us to vacate in two months.
- Encouragement for the women Andrea is building relationships with as they face many challenges as parents and need the peace of Jesus in their hearts.
- Opportunities for Mark to continue mentoring men who are seeking answers that only Jesus can give for their purpose and life's meaning.
- Continued success in learning the Catalan language and making connections with more of our community.







Group Discussion Questions

Read 1 Peter 2:11-25. If you are working through these questions with a group, have someone read the passage aloud.

1. Look at 1 Peter 2:11. What two descriptions does Peter use to describe his readers? (Note: different translations will use different words.) What point is Peter trying to make by using these descriptions?
2. According to verse 12, how should believers live among their neighbors? What if our neighbors aren't so nice to us?
3. According to verses 13-16, how should believers behave in relation to governing authorities?
4. According to verse 15, what purpose does living as an upstanding citizen serve? Why is this important?
5. What does Peter write about how Christian slaves should behave in verses 18-20? Does what Peter writes relate to what we know as the employer-employee relationship?
6. What is the common instruction that Peter has for living alongside our neighbors, living under government, and working under a boss?
7. Who did Peter use an example for us in verses 21-25?
8. Overall, what is the main point Peter wants us to get from what he wrote in 1 Peter 2:11-25? Do you think some people might struggle with what Peter commands? If so, why?
