- Please pray for our kids continual understanding and growth in the Truth.



Group Discussion Questions


1. Prior to today's message, what was your understanding about Lent? Did you have any misconceptions about Lent? Was there something you appreciated learning about Lent?
2. Lent is viewed as a time to streamline our lives for the purpose of making more room for God. To do this, we have to let some things go that clutter up our lives. How does Jesus' teaching in Matthew 16:24 correlate with the spirit of Lent?
3. When it comes to our worship of God, our expressions typically fall into 2 categories: celebrative and reflective. For the most part, the season of Lent falls into the reflective category. What types of things are good to reflect upon as we approach Easter?
4. The concept of fasting is very common in the Bible, and yet in our culture, fasting for spiritual reasons is almost unheard of. Have you ever fasted? What was your experience like? If you haven't fasted, have you had some fears/concerns that kept you from participating in a fast?
5. Why do you think people in our culture struggle with things that Jesus talked about (and practiced) like slowing down and pursuing quiet for times of prayer?
6. If Jesus is God, why would he choose to go into the wilderness for a time of fasting, praying, and meditating? How should Jesus' example impact our thoughts about fasting?
7. What are some ways God desires to spiritually enrich us when we go without some of the things our flesh craves?
8. Fasting is typically equated with going without food for a time of prayer. What other things might a person go without in order to clear their minds and starve the flesh?

GETTING PERSONAL: Is there a habit or sin in my life that repeatedly gets in the way of loving God with my whole heart or loving my neighbor as myself? What can I do to permanently weed out that habit?

FOUNDATIONS BIBLE STUDY


