Local Outreach Highlight UGM Center for Women & Children

Brianna never set out to abandon her child, but when her destructive life choices led her away from Daisy, God put people in her life to bring her back, from a jail mate, to a lawyer, to UGM volunteers and staff.

Boredom led Brianna to begin taking risks and experimenting with alcohol and drugs at age 18. By 19 she was married to an addict and pregnant. They both attempted to get clean for the baby, but after several relapses, Brianna started to admit she did not have control over her addiction. She spent two months in jail and Daisy was placed in the custody of CPS. Brianna didn't think she was actually ready for a complete life change, but she did desperately want her daughter back. A woman in jail told her about the two-year UGM recovery program and that she could have her daughter with her. She talked to her public defender and was furloughed long enough to attend an orientation.

Even though Brianna knew next to nothing about the UGM Women's Recovery program at the UGM Center for Women and Children, she chose to do the hard work to start turning her life around. Visitations with Daisy started almost immediately, and soon, the little one was allowed to live with her full time. She entered parenting classes in addition to taking on a full schedule of addiction recovery classes, life skills training, and intensive counseling. She learned financial planning, kitchen basics, and got her first steady job in years.

The most profound change that occurred was Brianna's acceptance of God's unconditional love. She started building a relationship with Jesus that fulfilled her in a way she'd never known was possible. "My life has only gone up here. It's been nothing but growth. I don't want to do drugs anymore...I'm a completely different person than I was when I came in. My goals now are completely different than they were two years ago."


