## Message Reflection Questions

1. Read through 1 John 5:14-17 and answer this question: What is the main idea John wants me to get?
2. What is the key to confident prayer according to 1 John 5:14? How does a person go about figuring out what God's will is?
3. What is in us that sometimes motivates us to pray our will over God's will?
4. What are some examples of self-focused prayers? What types of things does God want us praying about?
5. How does verse 16 remind us of the importance for praying on behalf of others?
6. Do you know someone who has drifted/wandered in their walk with Jesus? How might you pray for them? Why should we pray for these people?
7. Considering verses 16-17 and the idea of "sins that lead to death," is there anything a person can do to destroy all chances of being redeemed by God?
