We live in Cape Town, South Africa; it is one of the most beautiful places in the world. We have some of the most stunning beaches on the planet. We are in the southern hemisphere, so while you are playing in the snow we are swimming at the beach or pool trying to keep cool. South Africa is also a rough place to live at times. It is violent and the unemployment rate is 50%. There are electricity crises; we don't have supply on all the time. The economy is unstable, the politicians are crooked and people can often give in to fear.

Our ministry is to preach the Gospel and all the Scriptures in a practical way so we can equip people to live out the Christian life. One of the challenges is to mobilize the majority of our members to be fully committed and devoted to Jesus Christ and to the mission we've been called to. People sometimes get distracted from the mission because they are in survival mode and get quite callous toward those around.

We also work with two non-profit organizations and they help us serve the poorest people in our city. We feed hundreds of children every day. We have two preschools, a medical clinic, and a sports ministry. My wife, Cyndi, started and runs the tutoring program because education is so important to help disadvantaged people get back on their feet. We desire to get our church members to serve in these capacities because God's heart is for the poor.

One of my favorite things to do in ministry is to be with people. Ministry is about people. We love to have people over for meals to see what God is doing in their life. That is one of the most encouraging things about working in the front lines of ministry.

Message Reflection Questions

Read through John 12:1-8, then work through the following questions:

1. Who were Mary, Martha and Lazarus to Jesus? What was the purpose for having Jesus in their house?
2. What did Mary do that might be considered impetuous and extravagant? Why would Mary do such a thing? Why might this make some people uncomfortable?
3. How did Judas respond to Mary’s act of adoration? What does verse 6 tell us about Judas’ true concerns?
4. How did Jesus defend Mary according to verses 7-8? What are your thoughts on Jesus’ response?
5. What’s the most interesting/helpful/important thing you gleaned from John 12:1-8?

Read John 12:9-19, then spend some time processing the following questions:

6. What was the reaction as word spread that Jesus was entering Jerusalem (verses 12-13)? Why were they doing these things?
7. What Old Testament prophecy was fulfilled according to verses 14-16? What’s the significance of Jesus riding a young colt?
8. What prior event led so many of the people to come out and see Jesus once again (verse 17-18)?
9. What was the reaction of the Pharisees as they observed everything going on with Jesus? What emotions do you think they were feeling?
10. What’s the most interesting/helpful/important thing you gleaned from John 12:9-19?
