In August we had the visit of the consultants of the mission and we have officially started learning the Tseltal culture and language. Although learning the language and culture is difficult and seems like a hindrance to ministry, it actually provides a healthy period of time for genuine friendships to develop, for trust to grow, and for us to gain a valuable understanding of the context in which we live. We have spent time with the people, developing relationships, going with them to the maize field, learning to plant beans, putting down compost and fertilizer, helping to cook their clay pots, going to picnics to eat, walk and spend time with people.

The study of language and culture is divided into several stages and each one has a low, medium and high level. By studying 40 hours a week, an unwritten language can be learned in about 3 years, depending on the difficulty of the language. For now, we are in stage 1, where we focus on learning individual words and phrases. All this in the context of culture and always developing close relationships with people.

The town has some big religious and cultural divisions. When there are events where the whole town is involved, for example, a funeral, they do things together but there is really no good friendship between them. We have noticed on some occasions that some who call themselves "Christians" do not participate and do not help those who are not from their group and vice versa. It is very encouraging for us, when some people greet us and ask us questions and want to talk with us. We are encouraged to see that people are reaching out to us for help, regardless of us being Christian missionaries.

The rainy season caused our bathroom wall to be damaged, and now that it is over, we thank God for His provision to repair it and that a friend from town was able to help us do it. We ask for your prayers that our relationship with him and his family may grow, and they may come to know the Lord.

Prayer Requests:

- May the Lord give us wisdom as we learn this complicated language and make deep friendships with the people of the town. May they see us as friends and trust us. May we be witnesses to the love of Christ.
- May the Lord help us to keep our focus on Him, maintaining a calm spirit and an unwavering focus on Christ.
- For unity in the team, may God give us wisdom and guide us in all decisions and may we reflect his love towards the people.
- For our marriage, may the Lord be glorified through our lives- that we can be a light and witness to others.
- May the Lord continue to provide for us, including our health as Mariana deals with allergies.
