Reaching & Teaching

After our four-month stateside assignment, we arrived back in Argentina around the first of April. Our trip was a time to make connections and minister to our supporting churches, friends, and family. We enjoyed many coffee dates, meals, and get-togethers. Eric was blessed to be able to preach and share about missions at all of our supporting churches. He traveled to a doctoral class and taught at a biblical counseling conference in Mexico. We were able to share about missions at the Cross Conference in Louisville, Kentucky. We ministered in many different church groups, from Awana kids to college groups to home groups. The kids got to eat American foods, enjoy things like doughnuts and pepperoni pizza, play in American parks, and experience the Christmas season. They enjoyed sleep-overs, park playdates and snow days with grandparents, great-grandparents, aunts, uncles, cousins and more. It was also a time to take care of ourselves. We had medical check-ups, home-school testing, speech therapy assessments, and more. We were able to rest and take vacation in Florida, where Eric's mom lives.

Our trip wasn't without challenges; challenges like living out of a suitcase for so long, getting COVID, mourning the deaths of several good friends, and saying hello and then goodbye many times to our loved ones. But we came away so thankful for all these and more blessings!

We are now so glad to be back in Cordoba! It was a blessing for us to realize that we had a great desire to come back to our home here, even after all these amazing months in the states. Our hearts are still here in Argentina, and we are grateful for the call and desire that God has placed in us to serve Jesus here! Now that we're back, our to-do lists are long with gospel ministry to do. Eric was home for a few weeks before he left on a trip with the William Carey Seminary to Spain, Switzerland and North Africa. This seminary was started through our local church, and has a new online biblical counseling program. Eric is in charge of this program. He is traveling with two fellow missionaries who also work with the seminary. They met students, encouraged pastors and made connections to further the work online and in Spanish-speaking Europe.

Danica is homeschooling the boys again and loves it. The school year runs from March-Dec. We are grateful for the opportunity to disciple our kids daily.

Message Reflection Questions

1. Read through 1 John 5:1-4. What are some of the main points that stand out in this passage?
2. In verse 1, John writes how the person born of God must believe that Jesus is the Christ/Messiah? Why is it so important to recognize Jesus in this way?
3. What are some of the ways people get it wrong about who Jesus is?
4. Throughout 1 John, John has harped on the idea that the Christian must love fellow brothers and sisters in Christ. Why is this such a high value in God's economy?
5. Process this statement from 1 John 5:2: "This is how we know that we love God's children: when we love God and obey his commands." This seems like a funny statement. How does it work that by loving God and obeying his commands that we love other Christians?
6. Read 1 John 5:1-4. How can a follower of Jesus experience success/victory over the struggles and challenges of this world?
7. What makes God's commands "not burdensome"?
8. What tools has God provided for our spiritual success?
